who is alive and reigns with you,

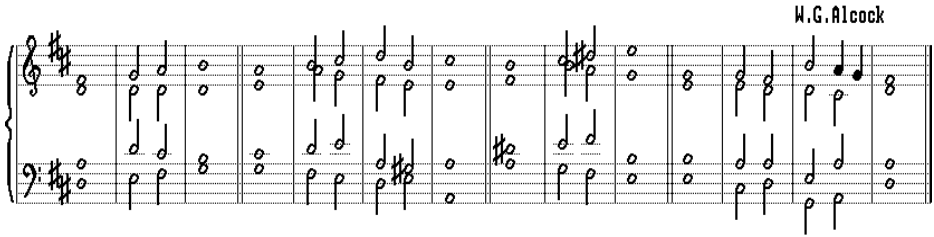
